Please attach a resume that includes the facility, unit, and clinical area where you are currently employed and working as an LPN (e.g., Rockyview General Hospital, Unit 73, General Medicine). Include your education/employment history and other relevant skills, credentials, and professional development (e.g., certification, workshops, etc.)

<u>Please note</u>: Students cannot be placed on the same unit where they are working as an LPN. However, another unit in the same facility is acceptable.

<u>NURS 441</u> is a final consolidated practicum. **Placement requests must be appropriately related to the individual student's current and previous clinical experience** (e.g., if a student's LPN practice has been on a sub-acute unit, in long term care, or community health that student will not be placed in the OR, ER, or Critical Care for NURS 441). There are no exceptions.

Specialty Area Clinical Placements:

- Students requesting placements in specialty clinical areas (including but not limited to the OR, ER, Critical Care, Labor and Delivery, Oncology, Pediatrics, NICU, PICU) must have:
 - A minimum Program GPA of 3.7 (A-)
 - Current acute care experience of one year or more applicable to the request (e.g., students without acute care pediatric experience will not be considered for the PICU, Pediatric Oncology).
 - o Completed NURS 401 before trying to sign up on the eligibility list.



- Specialty area clinical placement requests and assignments are at the sole discretion of Athabasca University.
- If the eligibility criteria are met, the Clinical Placement Coordinator and/or Program Director, Clinical Affairs will review the student's NURS 401 evaluation and contact the NURS 401 instructor. Therefore, students who are completing NURS 401 and then NURS 441 in consecutive terms are not eligible for consideration for specialty placement requests. Medicine and surgical units are acceptable, as are Community, Mental Health and Geriatrics.
- If the criteria are not met, the next non-specialty clinical placement suggestion on the form is requested.
- If a decline is received for a specialty area, the next request(s) must be for a general clinical area (e.g., medicine, surgery, mental health, community health). Example of a placement request:
 - 1. Misericordia ER Do not request the ER in four different locations.
 - 2. Misericordia Surgery
 - 3. Grey Nuns Surgery
 - $4. \ \ Misericordia-Medicine$

We work with clinical agencies to support the appropriateness of these clinical areas in relation to student background/experience. It is also important to note that these areas accept the least number of students.

Out-of-Province Clinical Placement Requests:

- Students living outside Alberta, are considered as out-of-province students for clinical placements in their home province. Clinical agencies must place their local school students first (according to contractual agreements), followed by other in-province schools; then they consider our requests. Requests for Specialty areas will not be considered.
- **In BC**, you must *only* suggest facilities within the same health region of your current employment and you must submit a photocopy of your staff ID badge alongside your resume.
- In Ontario, several facilities/areas decline all AU requests for Fall and Winter terms as they are over-capacity with Ontario students.
- In the Saskatoon Health Region, *all* AU requests for *all* terms are *declined* as they are over-capacity with Saskatoon Health Region students.
- If an out-of-province student's requests are declined for two consecutive terms, this student must travel to Alberta to complete NURS 441.
- Please consider all this information as you plan and make your placement suggestions.

Students living in Alberta and BC: Placements are managed in electronic systems.

Students living outside Alberta and BC: In addition to the facility name,

Athabasca University reserves the right to assign students to where placements can be confirmed. There is no guarantee you will be placed in a preferred area. Students do not contact management, clinical educators, or staff to request their own placements. Doing so will result in:

- immediate removal from the NURS 441 placement process;
- a delay in eligibility list for a future term(s);
- possible refusal of placement requests at that facility or an entire health region.

If no placement is available by the deadlines below, the student's registration will be cancelled, tuition refunded, and the student's name will be added to the eligibility list as a high priority for the next term:

Fall term: Monday at 1630, two weeks before September 1. Winter term: December 15 at 1630 Spring/Summer term: Monday at 1630, two weeks before May 1.
